

## **PROFILE VALIDITY**

This MMPI-2 clinical profile is only marginally valid because of her effort to appear highly responsible and free of psychopathology. Her overly cautious approach to the items suggests that she is concerned with making a good impression and is reluctant to disclose much about her personal adjustment. Interpretation of the clinical profile should allow for her possible minimization of problems.

## **SYMPTOMATIC PATTERNS**

The client's MMPI-2 clinical scales are within normal limits; however, she endorsed some item content that may be important to consider in this evaluation.

In addition, the following description is suggested by the content of the client's item responses. The client does not report being an overly anxious person prone to developing unrealistic fears. Any fears she reports are likely to be viewed by her as reality-based rather than internally generated.

## **INTERPERSONAL RELATIONS**

Quite outgoing and sociable, she has a strong need to be around others. She is gregarious and enjoys attention. Personality characteristics related to social introversion-extraversion tend to be stable over time. The client is typically outgoing, and her sociable behavior is not likely to change if she is retested at a later time.

The content of this client's MMPI-2 responses suggests the following additional information concerning her interpersonal relationships. She tends to approach relationships with some caution and skepticism. She views her home life in a generally positive manner; she reports that it is pleasant and problem-free. She feels strong emotional support from those close to her.


## **MENTAL HEALTH CONSIDERATIONS**


